Shooting Sports

Shooting Sports activities are going on a normal schedule this year. Remember youth must participate in **one qualifying shoot**, do a demonstration, project

talk and complete a record book to complete the project. Youth with **three qualified shoots** and are the top scores in the discipline can qualify for the state championship. Display board or a standalone project of red ribbon quality must also be completed to qualify for the state championship shoot.

Horse IDs and Lease Affidavits

4-H members with **NEW** horse projects will need to fill out a Horse ID form and a Lease Affidavit and have them turned in to the extension office by **May** 1st to participate in the KCC Fair or Colorado State Fair. Forms are available on the KCC 4-H web page or at the extension office. If you have questions, contact Scott at the Extension Office.

KCC 4-H Horse Riding Nights

Market Goat, Sheep and Swine Nominations

There will be a Sheep weigh-in for the 2023 KCC Fair. Weigh-in will be 3:30 PM to 6:00 PM on **May 15.**

It is the responsibility of the youth exhibitor to nominate their market goat and swine projects to be eligible to show and sell at the KCC Fair. For swine and goats, exhibitors must complete a nomination form, as well as tag and picture of each animal. A color picture of the head of the animal with the tag in the animal's ear must be submitted. The picture of the animal's ear tag must have a readable tag number. Swine exhibitors must also include ear notches on the nomination form.

Nomination forms and ear tags are available at the Extension Office. A fee of \$5 per head must be paid when the tags are picked up. Completed nomination forms and pictures are due to the Extension Office: Monday, May 15, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.

Contact Scott at the Extension Office to set up an appointment or check out the portable scales. Last day to use scales is Friday, July 14.

Cow Patty Bingo Tickets

Cow Patty Ticket packets have been given to club main leaders. Ticket stubs and money should be returned to the Extension Office as soon as possible. All money & ticket stubs must be turned in to the Extension Office by **4:00 p.m. on Friday, June 30**. Clubs will receive \$1.00 per ticket sold and turned in prior to the deadline. The club or clubs selling the grand prize ticket will receive an additional \$50.00.

4-H Project Requirements

<u>4-H Project Syllabus</u>: The syllabus contains important exhibit information and requirements for general, family & consumer science, shooting sports, and primary projects. Remember to check the syllabus for specific display details as you prepare your projects for the fair. The 2023 KCC Fair 4-H Project Syllabus is available at the Extension Office and is posted online at

<u>Fair Book</u>: 4-H Livestock and Open Class entry information can be found in the Fair Book when it becomes available. The 2023 Fair Book will also be available online at: <u>http://kitcarsoncounty.colorado.gov/fair-</u> grounds/county-fair.

<u>Foods & Clothing Projects</u>: A letter will be sent to members in late May with instructions on the preentry requirement and pre-entry forms. These entry forms will be due in the office by Monday, June 26th so the judging schedules can be done and sent out.

Fair Project Entry: Project check-in for <u>ALL</u> 4-H general projects, 4-H shooting sports, 4-H home economics (*except foods & cake decorating*), primary 4-H record books and Ag mechanics will take place **Friday, July 21. All 4-H judging will take place on Saturday July 22.**

2023 Fair Booth Theme

The 2023 Fair Booth theme is "*Fields of Opportunities*" Booths need to be **completed by Friday, July 21 by 2 p.m. and will be judged on Saturday July 22**. Call the Extension Office to reserve your club booth space.

Manual Orders

Project Manuals are crucial to successfully completing a project. They can consider different aspects you may not have thought of when doing your project. To help members get the most from their projects, we are asking the club leaders to collect the orders for 4-H project manuals from their membership. Literature orders are due to the Extension office no later than May 22, 2023 to give some time after the add/drop deadline. The Extension Office will order the literature and bill individual 4-H clubs for all members' purchases. Members will need to check with their clubs on how to pay for it. Josilyn will be sending each club leader a report stating which members have indicated they would like to order manuals. Please doublecheck this information with your club members and then complete the literature order form. Please check online to see if the one you need is in PDF form online or if it needs to be ordered.

Swine ID

Swine identification for 2023 will remain unchanged from previous years. Ear tags and taggers are available to pick up in the Extension Office. Members need to pick up their tags and ID forms at the Extension Office. Members will tag their pigs, take pictures of both sides of the pig and a picture of the pig's ear with the tag in place. You will fill out a hard copy of the identification form and submit it to

the Extension Office. All ID's are due **Monday**, **May 8th**, **2023** no exceptions!



Record Book and Project Requirements

With general projects please keep in mind the size and how easy projects may be transported, if you are selected for state fair. **If you are enrolled in a livestock project,**

Sedgwick County has a different record book.

You will be judged on these and not the ones found online. Josilyn will email them out so be watching your emails. She can also print them off in the office if need be.

I signed up for a project... now what do I do??

Get involved: Make sure that you are attending club meetings. This is where you can ask questions, get reminders about upcoming deadlines, work on community service projects, and share your project knowledge in a demonstration.

Order a manual: We don't always have a volunteer leader for each project but we can offer some great curriculum to help you learn. If you haven't already ordered a manual, contact the Extension office.

Start working on your record book: A record book needs to be completed for each project. We suggest getting an early start before summer gets busy. We utilize the state e-record books which are all available to download from the state 4-H website. Go to www.colorado4h.org and select 4-H programs and projects. You can click on the individual project area or download multiple books at once from the "download all e-records" icon. Most record books are due on the Tuesday prior to fair (July 18). The exceptions to this are the dog record books (typically due earlier) and the cooking and cake decorating books due during fair.
