

Time Management Tips for Busy 4-H Youth

Between school, 4-H activities, family responsibilities, and personal interests, life can get busy for 4-H youth. Learning to manage your time effectively is essential for staying on top of responsibilities while still having time for fun and relaxation. Some ways that youth can

balance a multitude of responsibilities include planning ahead, prioritizing tasks, and scheduling fun events and downtime.

Often, when schedules are busy and many activities overlap, it can be challenging to remember so many things at once. Use a planner, calendar, or app to keep track of deadlines, meetings, and events. Write down upcoming 4-H project deadlines, club meetings, and other commitments as soon as you learn about them. Seeing your schedule laid out will help you prioritize and avoid last-minute stress. At the start of each week, review this calendar or schedule to ensure that you are aware of all upcoming responsibilities and deadlines. To easily distinguish between 4-H, sports, family events, and other activities, you can color-code your planner. For example, write everything to do with 4-H in green, everything for sports in blue, and school deadlines in red. This can make your planner or calendar easier to navigate.

Learning to identify which tasks are most important and tackling those first can reduce stress, improve focus, and help you accomplish your goals. In prioritizing tasks, it is important to recognize the urgency of deadlines and determine how much work is required to complete a task. To determine which tasks are the most urgent, you can break them into categories of 'Important and Urgent', 'Important but Not Urgent', and 'Not Important and Not Urgent'. An example of a task that is both important and urgent is a large assignment due in a week that is worth over half a grade for a class. An example of not important and not urgent would be scrolling social media or reorganizing your desk unnecessarily.

Working constantly and not allowing time for fun or relaxation can lead to burnout or take joy out of the activities you are doing currently. Make time for things you enjoy, whether that's spending time with friends, reading, or relaxing. This can be achieved by leaving one day a week open for free time and saying no to additional tasks. Sometimes, schedules can be so full that a full day cannot be dedicated to fun. In this case, allow for short breaks to allow for recharging.

It is also important to ask for help when needed, reflect on progress made and celebrate success along the way. Learning to manage your time is a skill that will serve you well, not only in 4-H but in all areas of life.

Beef Weigh In

Beef Weigh-in will be SATURDAY February 8th, from 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM.

Any market beef cattle who may be showing at the KCC fair, or will be nominated for the Colorado State Fair, must weigh in during those times in order to be eligible to show at either fair. CATTLE MUST BE BROKE TO LEAD ACROSS SCALES. This is due to safety concerns, and wear and tear on the scale equipment. Cattle that cannot be led across will not be weighed in.

There will be 163 days between weigh-in and fair. Weight ranges have not changed for 2025 at fair. All Market Heifers and Steers must weigh 1,000 to 1,600 pounds. No minimum rate of gain requirement for the livestock sale at fair, but this weight will be used to determine the animal's rate of gain.

Cost is \$5 per animal (for tags and scale certification and scale repairs) If you do not have a brand inspection for your calves it can be done at weigh in as well.

Junior Superintendents

4-H or FFA members 12 years and up, who are interested in being Junior Superintendents for the 2025 KCC Fair need to contact the Extension office and sign up by February 3rd. We ask that junior livestock superintendents not apply for a specie they intend to show at the fair.



Market beef weigh-in will be held at the Sedgwick County Fairgrounds on Sunday, February 9th starting at 12:30 p.m.



inspection paper or official bill of sale at this time to prove ownership. If you do not weigh-in, you are not eligible to show at county fair. Remember, 4-H members are not required to attend weigh-in if they have prior commitments; however, your animal will need to be weighed-in at this time. If someone else is weighing your animals, we will need to know which animal

belongs to which child AT THE TIME OF WEIGH-IN

in order to accurately complete our paperwork. For safety reasons, we encourage all market beef exhibitors to start halter breaking your steer or heifer before weighin. The weight range for county fair will be 1050-1500 lbs. for steers and 1000-1500 for heifers.

Don't forget to get your local 4-H scholarship applications! They are due to the Extension office by April 1st. They will be made available middle of January.


LITERATURE ORDERS

Project Manuals are crucial to successfully completing a project. They can take into account different aspects you may not have thought of when doing your project. There have been a couple of changes this year. To help members get the most from their projects, we are asking

the club leaders to collect the orders for 4-H project manuals from their membership. Literature orders are due to the Extension office no later than May 19, 2025 to give some time after the add/drop deadline. However, we will be making an early bird order on March 15th, 2025. The Extension Office will order the literature and bill individual 4-H clubs for all members' purchases. Members will need to check with their clubs on how to pay for it. Josilyn will be sending each club leader a report stating which members have indicated they would like to order manuals. Please double check this information with your club members and then complete the literature order form. Double check to see if it is available on https://co4h.colostate.edu/programareas/colorado-4-h-project-information/. Several of the Manuals are now in PDF form.

If you are new to a



4-H livestock project, you are required to participate in the training the first two years of your project. There will be information mailed to each member individually about the MQA. You will need to re-certify when you are 12 and again when you are 15. Please contact the Extension office if you have questions about this. Livestock projects that require MQA training include: beef, sheep, swine, goats, rabbits, and poultry. If you haven't met this requirement by **June 15, 2025**, you will NOT be eligible to show at fair. Contact the Extension Office with any questions.

ADD/DROP DATE

The add/drop date will be **May 15th** this year. This allows you some extra time to decide on what projects you would like to do.

RECORD BOOK FOLDERS

If you didn't purchase a record book folder last year, or you are a new member this year, please call or stop by the Extension Office to purchase you record book folder for this year. You are encouraged to use a record book folder for all record books (livestock, horse and general). The cost is \$4 per folder. 




Project Requirements

(Please note that this may be last year's information. We will share any new project requirements or information as it gets updated by the state!)

Carnival - At this time, the county is NOT planning to host an annual spring carnival.



Market Beef Weigh In

Market beef weigh-in is tentatively scheduled for **SATURDAY**, February 15 from 7:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. at the Eastern Colorado Research Station north of Akron. All market steers and market heifers MUST be weighed in on this date to be eligible to show at county fair - NO EXCEPTIONS.

Be sure to bring your brand inspection or an official bill of sale to prove ownership of your animal. The brand inspector will be onsite collecting that information. 4-H members enrolled in the market beef project will receive a postcard with more details in January.

State fair exhibitors – State fair animals are not required to be weighed in BUT they all must be tagged with a county tag. Be sure to go online and order DNA packets to be returned to the state fair by April 1st. Nomination forms are also required and can be picked up from Jamie at the office. Those completed forms must be returned to the office by April 1st.

Save the Dates: Livestock, Horse and Dog Weigh Ins/ID Deadlines

Horse and Dog identification is due in 4Honline by May 1st. Swine identification is due Thursday, May 1. Sheep and Goat weigh in has been tentatively set for Monday, May 5 from 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds. Our annual Meat Quality Assurance training is tentatively scheduled for Monday, May 12th but additional dates may be added earlier in April. More details about all of these events and deadlines will be sent out this spring.

Livestock Record Book

4-H livestock projects will again be using a county book, <u>not the state e-record</u>. Livestock record books are due on the Tuesday prior to county fair (July 15) by 4:30 p.m. in the Extension Office. Catch it participants showing through 4-H still need to complete a 4-H record book in addition to their catch it book.

Shooting Sports Safety Meeting Attendance Requirements

Members who are shooting in their 1st or 2nd year and who have reached the age of 12 and 14 will be required to attend a safety meeting. If these requirements do not apply to you, then you are not required to attend the Safety Meeting to be held on February 18th. We recommend all shooting sports members attend the safety class, but it is REQUIRED for members in their 1st or 2nd year are ages 12 or 14.
